Please do not use automatic numbering. The ‘Introduction’ and ‘Conclusions’ sections should not be numbered.

Please use no more than two level of headings. Do not use two heading next to each other without text in-between.

When a direct quotation is used, always include the author, year, and page number as part of the citation and please include double quotation marks (“ ”).

When a citation is used, source material must be documented in the body of the paper by citing the author(s) and year of the sources.


In sources with more than 2 authors the reference should be as in the example from text (first author's surname “*et al.*”, year), and in the reference all authors must be included

Bullets & Numbering: use simple lines or arab numbers, TNR 11, Hanging: 0,63 cm;

A quotation with 40 or more words should be included in block format (without quotation marks) apart from the surrounding text – indent: left & right 0,5 cm

Pellentesque feugiat sapien a tincidunt suscipit. Fusce fermentum tincidunt lacus, eget viverra ipsum porttitor vitae (see Figure 1).

Images, graphs and maps should be named “Figure” and counted from 1 to n. TNR 11, Bold, justified

Insert only jpg. or png. formats, high-quality (min. 300 dpi). For all the text in the figure use only TNR font.

All figures should have the width of the page.

Source: please indicate the author, TNR 10 pct

2. Turpis purus

All tables should have the width of the page. Info inside tables should be written with TNR font, 10 pct.

Please indicate the source of data. If using data from a well-known database (Eurostat, World Bank, etc.) it is not necessary to describe it in the reference section.

Math equations should be submitted as **editable text** and not as images. Present simple formula in line with normal text where possible and use “/” instead of a horizontal line for small fractional terms.

Acknowledgements should be included at the end of the article before the references (not include them as a footnote to the title or otherwise).

The complete references list is placed at the end of the paper, listed in alphabetical order. It should be **single spaced**, **TNR**, **size 10**, **hanging: 1 cm**;

Please consider the examples in the next section.

How to cite

General rules:

- All references included in the reference list should be cited in the text, and vice versa.
- It is recommended to indicate the page for a citation.
- In case of sources in a language other than English shall be use the original title in Latin alphabet
- Arrange all sources alphabetically, not by format of publication (book, journal, etc.)
- web sources with very large links, it is recommended to shorten them (use <http://www.webcitation.org/archive.php>)

Citation in text

Source with one author:	Smith (2013, p. 52) indicate that... or (Smith, 2013, p. 52)
Source with two authors:	Smith and Danson (2013, p. 52) indicates that... or (Smith and Danson 2012, p. 52)
Source with more than two authors:	(Smith <i>et al.</i> , 2013, pp. 52-53)
Two or more works in the same citation (alphabetically, then cronologically):	Several authors indicate (Danson, 2013; Smith <i>et al.</i> , 2013; Wiley, 2010; 2014)

<i>Book with two authors</i>	Smith, M. and Danson, M. (2012), <i>Regional Governance, Institutions and Development</i> , London: Routledge.

Preferable as footnote In case of a large number of references to newspaper articles, it is required to place them in the footnotes rather than in the reference list at the end of the manuscript.

If you use a set of data source for a table or figure, it is not necessary to include this source in the reference list.
